THE SEAHAWKS ARE IN THE SUPER BOWL!

This will be a fun week in Olympia as the approach of the Super Bowl has everyone excited for the big game! Despite that great news, two weeks into session the legislature is getting down to business. The first two or three weeks of a short session are often dominated by a frenzy of bill introductions and committee hearings in order for bills to pass before the first cutoff. The major political news of the week revolved around the House Democratic proposal to increase the minimum wage to \$12 per hour by 2017. HB 2672 introduced by Rep Jessyn Farrell (D-Seattle) would incrementally raise the wage by a dollar an hour in 2015, 2016 and 2017 until the wage gets to \$12. The minimum wage discussion became a political hot button in Olympia as a result of a CIty of Seatac initiative that narrowly passed in November, raising the minimum wage to \$15 per hour in that city. This legislative proposal is unlikely to get traction in the Republican majority Senate and is clearly an election year campaign item.

CCF News

Several more bills of interest to the Coaltion were introduced this week. Bills on invasive species, derelict vessels and oil transportation safety among others. As I reported previously, the House Ag and Natural Resources Committee heard testimony on HB 2143, concerning genetically modified finfish. Due to significant opposition from the food industry and Farm Bureau, the bill sponsor Rep Cary Condotta (R-Wenatchee) re-wrote the bill and introduced it as HB 2630. This bill simply requires that "transgenic" fish be labeled as such. The bill has not been scheduled for a hearing.

The House Environment committee also heard a bill of interest to CCF regarding oil transportation. HB 2347 would make changes to tug escort requirements, require a new report on the movement of oil in the state and treble natural resource damages for reckless spills. Bill sponsor Rep Jessyn Farrell (D-Seattle) admitted that this bill was drafted incorrectly and will change dramatically before it moves out of committee, specifically citing errors that mandate an increase of the use of tugs in Greys Harbor and the Columbia River. A new draft of the bill is expected early next week.

Another bill of interest to CCF was heard in the Senate Natural Resources Committee. SB 6072 concerning forage fish was sponsored by Senator Christine Rolfes (D-Bainbridge Island). Sen Rolfes testified that the bill would provide insight into an overlooked and crucial part of the ecosystem and was supported in testimony by representatives of the Puget Sound Partnership and Sound Action. However, Michele Culver of WDFW testified that the fiscal note on the bill would likely be 3 or 4 million dollars and was therefore cost prohibitive. Al Carter testified on behalf of Ocean Gold Seafoods and raised similar concerns. The Chair of the Senate Natural Resources committee says this bill is unlikely to move.
