### COVID-19

UN INTERGOVERNMENTAL CONFE-RENCE ON MARINE BIODIVERSITY

### OF AREAS BEYOND NATIONAL JU-RISDICTION - ABNJ/BBNJ

The Fourth Session of the Conference has been rescheduled to "early next year".

### DOMESTIC MANAGEMENT - PFMC

Council appointments were announced on June 28. Christa was reappointed as an Oregon Representative. Bob Dooley was reappointed as a California Representative. Corey Ridings, Ocean Conservancy, was appointed as a California Representative.

The June PFMC meeting did have

some discussions centered on the albacore fishery. The HMSAS offered the following comments on the NMFS overview of the June 1 Stakeholder Meeting (see pages 2 - 3 of F.2.b Supp HMSAS Report 1 June 2021 (pcouncil.org). The Council took no formal action; but agreed with industry's assessment that holding off on making any management proposals until next year is appropriate.

The PFMC also created an Ad Hoc Marine Planning Committee to gather industry and stakeholder input and advice on Marine Planning (Offshore Wind and Aquaculture). AAFA will have representation on this Committee.

### WIND FARMS OFF THE CALIFORNIA COAST

AAFA participated in the June 21 California Energy Commission Webinar and will be in attendance at the BO-EM-California Intergovernmental Task Force Meeting (July 13); and (2) A two-day (July 22nd and 23rd) PFMC meeting covering marine planning and offshore development.

Based on the June 21 Webinar, we are expecting lease sales off Morro Bay and Humboldt next summer. Note – lease sales do not mean steel will be immediately placed in the water; but it does start the final part of the process; and as we are seeing elsewhere in the US – the process is developing very quickly.

### OFFSHORE RENEWABLES OFF THE OREGON COAST

<u>OR 3375</u>, was signed into law by the Oregon Governor on June 23rd.

## OFFSHORE RENEWABLES OFF THE WASHINGTON COAST

On Friday, May 29, we heard that a developer was proposing for a 102 square mile offshore wind project off

Grays Harbor. Intel we have been able to gather indicates the industrial wind factory will be located 15 - 25 miles offshore.

## OTHER ITEMS WHICH AROSE PREVIOUSLY & CONTINUED THROUGH MAY 31, 2021.

• Construction began on the offshore wave energy test facility in early June. <u>See here (msn.com)</u>

• On June 8, the Ocean-Based Climate Solutions Act was introduced. As you will recall, this was introduced last fall; but failed to move. The new version does NOT include the prior version's Title II, which would have banned commercial extractive activities in at least 30% of the Nation's waters. We are continuing to digest the language of the 290-page bill.

• On June 11, the USCG issued a <u>Marine Safety Information Bulletin</u> which noted that mask wearing in outdoor areas of maritime transportation conveyances and hubs is no longer required. This MSIB reflects updated enforcement of the mask requirement for commercial vessels and maritime transportation hubs. It would be a good idea to have this available (a hard copy or the file itself) in case you are boarded by USCG and they are not aware of this MSIB.
