COVID-19 - SECOND ROUND OF FISHERIES ASSISTANCE

California – Disbursements are likely to occur during the second quarter of 2022. See - <u>California CARES Act</u> <u>Information – Fisheries Relief (psmfc.org)</u>

Oregon - Oregon's "Round 2" spend plan was approved on December 23 (see - <u>OR-CARES-2.0-spend-plan.pdf</u> (<u>psmfc.org</u>)). NORTH PACIFIC ALBACORE – MANAGEMENT STRATEGY EVALUATION ("MSE") & FUTURE MANAGEMENT OF THE FISHERY

NMFS hosting a virtual U.S. stakeholder meeting on April 5, 2022, to discuss harvest strategy options with a focus on preparing to potentially propose management objectives, limit, and target reference points to the IATTC. This is the next step in developing management measures for the north pacific albacore fishery. AAFA was well represented and conversations continue, both within AAFA and with other industry stakeholders, to derive an industry position in management objectives and reference points. A write-up on the Workshop was submitted to the PFMC by NMFS before the June

MARINE STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL (MSC)

On February I, the MSC released proposed changes to the MSC Fisheries Standard, Fisheries Certification Process and all associated program documents. AAFA has participated in a number of calls/meetings about these proposed changes. We are in the process of completing our annu al surveillance audit and we aren't expecting and issues to arise as a result.

US - CANADA PACIFIC ALBACORE TREATY

AAFA participated in the US-Canada Treaty Consultation meeting on June 7. By and large it was a review of information provided during the Data Working Group Call. There are plans for an in-person formal negotiation this fall.

UN INTERGOVERNMENTAL CONFERENCE ON MARINE BIODIVERSITY OF AREAS BEYOND NATIONAL JURIS-DICTION - ABNJ/BBNJ

On May 30, a Further revised draft text of an agreement under the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea on the conservation and sustainable use of marine biological diversity of areas beyond national jurisdiction was published – see IGC 5 - Further revised draft text_final (un.org). We have not yet had a chance to carefully review the full draft.

DOMESTIC MANAGEMENT - PFMC

It is expected that there will be discussions on albacore during the upcoming June meeting of the Pacific Fishery Management Council. We suspect the Council will be asked to provide guidance to NMFS regarding management objectives for the fishery and reference points (target and limit). AAFA will be represented at the PFMC meeting

WIND FARMS OFF THE CALIFORNIA COAST

On April 7, the California Coastal Commission held a hearing to consider BOEM's request for a Consistency Determination for activities which would be allowed pursuant to lease sales in the Humboldt WEA. The Commission conditionally concurred. It is expected the Commission will make a similar conditional concurrent when it meets to discuss lease sales in the Morro Bay WEA on June 8.


On May 31, BOEM published a <u>Proposed Sale Notice</u> for the two Wind Energy Areas (Humboldt and Morro Bay) off the California Coast. The public comment period for that closes on August 1. It is envisioned that a Final Sale Notice will be published shortly after September 1, and the lease sales will take place before the end of the year.

OFFSHORE RENEWABLES OFF THE OREGON COAST

On April 28, BEOM published in the Federal Register the Call Areas off Oregon – see https://www.regulations.gov/ document/BOEM-2022-0009-0001. The Public Comment period closes on June 28. In total, the areas cover roughly 1,200 square miles. By comparison, the two WEAs off California encompass 582 sq miles. The map of the three Call Areas off Oregon follows:

OTHER ITEMS THROUGH JUNE 7, 2022

On February 25, the <u>USCG published a notice seeking</u> information and comments related to the Pacific Coast-Port Access Route Study effort currently underway. In this notice, they seek "public comments regarding vessel traffic patterns in the areas near Point Mugu and south of the Channel Islands in the Pacific Missile Range, San Francisco Bay, and the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) Humboldt Bay and Morro Bay offshore Wind Energy Areas (WEAs). Information received will be used to make recommendations regarding establishing safety routing measures to improve waterway operations and vessel movement along the California coast." There is a list of 28 questions the USCG is seeking input on. The public comment period closes on May 26.

The USCG submitted its annual report to the PFMC. Of interest:</u>

"Two Canadian tuna trollers were boarded while fishing in the U.S. EEZ this year with no violations detected. All other Canadian vessels observed or queried were in compliance with applicable treaty provisions"

"The Coast Guard is particularly concerned with continued reporting from the U.S. and Canadian Albacore fleets of net marked fish and potential movement of the Chinese fleet toward the US EEZ. Any fishermen with specific reports of vessel names, dates, and/or locations of Chinese vessels operating in the Northeastern Pacific Ocean are encouraged to make a report to any of the PFMC Enforcement Consultants." To this end – if you are fishing and see any vessels matching this description – please forward that information to myself and the AAFA office and we will ensure it is communicated.
